Upcoming Quilt Auction Marks Twentieth Year

It was July 1992, when a small group of Sunset staff and volunteers traveled to Spicer, Minnesota to see first-hand how Greenlake Lutheran Bible Camp conducted its annual quilt auction. Through the efforts of the Development Director, Teryl Anderson, Sunset had scheduled its first Auction to be held on September 13th and everyone wanted to get it "right."

Getting it "right" was not an issue. Almost \$29,000 was raised that day with the top quilt selling for \$1500. One hundred sixteen quilts were sold and approximately 500 people attended. The Auction was definitely a success, and that was the beginning of many wonderful things for Lutheran Sunset Ministries.

Over the years more than 180 churches and 160 individuals have donated quilts and other handmade items raising a total of \$593,509. These funds have provided for projects and/or equipment that have directly benefitted LSM residents. From sitting room furniture to dining furniture to outdoor patios and pergolas the list is almost endless.

The good news is that the Auction continues because LSM is blessed to have so many friends and supporters who are willing to see it succeed. It has truly been a successful partnership in ministry. This year's Auction is scheduled for Saturday, October 15, 2011, at the Clifton City Park Armory. Previewing will begin at 10:00 a.m. and the auctioning will begin at 12:00 noon.

Message From The President

In preparation for this article for the Sunset News, I always review the previous article so I don't repeat myself. When I was doing that this time, I realized how much has happened in the last 4 months and I need to catch you up to speed on a lot of different topics.

First of all, thanks to all of you who wrote letters, made phone calls, or sent e-mails to your state legislators. Due to a tremendous response from all of us connected to long term care, the state legislature made no further cuts to us on Medicaid reimbursement. That seemed to be an impossible outcome based on where the legislature started this budget session but **WE DID IT!** We still have 3% in cuts in place made before the session started, but we can manage that.

Second, we are making some changes to our dining services. Beginning August 1, Morrison, a food service company, began operating our food services. We have always had the best food in town in our nursing home, but we wanted the dining experience to be even better. Our ultimate goal is to have more variety to the menu at all meals and have a longer time available for residents to be served their meals. The same dining staff is in place, no one lost their jobs, and Morrison allows us to have greater resources and expertise to support our goals.

Third, we are evaluating a new program called Home and Community Based Services. It will be all private pay for now, but would provide in home services such as planning, preparing and cleaning up after meals, monitoring diet and eating, medication reminders, helping run errands, providing light housekeeping, etc. All services offered through this program will help people to stay in their homes longer. We will be the only local provider of these services.

As you can see there is never a dull moment at Lutheran Sunset Ministries. Everything we do is done with the idea of improving people's lives because our overall goal is to be the "Provider of Choice".



Memorial Hall Removed From Campus

When Memorial Hall was constructed in 1959, Clifton Lutheran Sunset Home was only five years old. The building was dedicated at the fifth anniversary celebration of Sunset on October 4, 1959. It housed 48 residents in two large wings with a large kitchen and dining area. The addition allowed for Sunset to serve a total occupancy of 130 people on campus. It was an exciting addition and represented growth and advancement for the young ministry.

When a larger nursing facility was built in the 1970's, Memorial Hall became residential retirement which allowed for 17 residents to receive unlicensed support services such as meals, transportation, etc. After Rainbow Retirement Community was built in the 1980's, Memorial Hall was no longer used for residential living and then became a day care facility for employees children.

For a number of years it served only the children of LSM employees, but a partnership grew with Trinity Lutheran Church of Clifton to consolidate their Learning Center with the LSM program. For several years Trinity operated its Learning Center in that building.

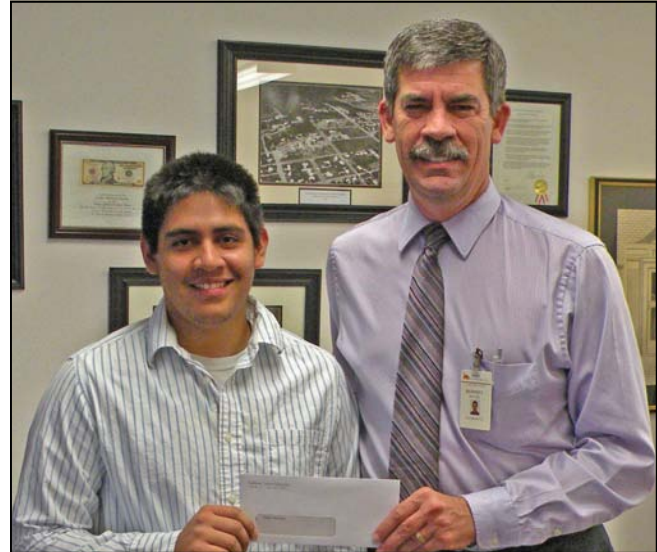
After the Learning Center closed Memorial Hall served as the location of LSM's training and educational programs and then, during the last few years housed the Pot O' Gold Thrift Store. In the Spring of 2011, during several days of very strong winds portions of the roof were damaged to a point beyond repair. Prior to the damage it was planned that the building would eventually be removed. Mother Nature took charge of that decision so the building had to be removed.

In the future additional retirement apartments are planned for the area where memorial Hall once stood.
